



## **Course Description**

### **LIT2090 | Contemporary Literature | 3.00 credits**

This course is a survey of contemporary prose and poetry. Prerequisites: ENC 1101, 1102 or equivalent

### **Course Competencies:**

1. Understanding specific literary elements and themes
2. Creating artifacts that respond to assigned texts through a critical perspective

3. Creating artifacts that support and include how literary works respond to and influence societies and cultures in various ways, including ethically, politically, and historically
